### 4. First aid measures

**Inhalation** Remove exposed person to fresh air. If breathing is labored, administer oxygen and obtain immediate medical attention. If irritation persists or if toxic symptoms are observed, get medical attention.

**Eye Contact** Flush with water at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention if eye irritation develops or persists.

<b>Skin Contact</b>	Wash immediately with soap and water. Remove soiled clothing. Get medical attention if irritation develops. Launder contaminated clothing.

## 5. Fire-fighting measures

Slightly Combustible. May release flammable vapors when heated above flash point.

<b>Extinguishing Media</b>	Carbon Dioxide, dry chemical, or foam. Avoid using water.
<b>Combustion Products</b>	Carbon monoxide and asphyxiants.
<b>Special Fire Procedures</b>	Recommend SCBA. Use water only for cooling container. Water may cause splattering, or transport the flame.

## 6. Accidental release measures

Evacuate all non-essential personnel. Personal Protective Equipment must be worn, see PPE section 8 & 16. Remove sources of ignition. Prevent entry into sewers and waterways. Contain release, pick up free liquid for recycling or disposal. Residual liquid can be absorbed with inert material. Check DOT/CERCLA and other agencies for reporting requirements.

Prevent contamination to soil, waterway and sewer systems.

## 7. Handling and storage

<b>Handling</b>	Avoid prolonged skin contact, breathing vapors, and contaminated clothing. Use with adequate ventilation. Wear recommended protective equipment. Practice good personal hygiene after handling. Empty containers retain material residue. Do not cut, weld, braze, solder or expose containers to other ignition sources.
<b>Storage</b>	Store in closed containers of proper construction. Store away from ignition sources and in areas of good ventilation.

## 8. Exposure controls and personal protection

<b>Exposure Limits</b>	The PEL (OSHA) and the TLV (ACGIH) is 5 mg/m <sup>3</sup> for oil mists.
<b>Ventilation</b>	Use in areas of adequate ventilation. Use mechanical exhaust to control vapors or mists.

<b>Gloves</b>	Nitrile or neoprene gloves are recommended.
<b>Eye Protection</b>	Safety glasses, goggles, or face shield are recommended.
<b>Respiratory Protection</b>	Use NIOSH/MSHA approved respirator with organic vapor cartridge and dust/mist cartridge is recommended if exposure limit is exceeded. Self-contained breathing apparatus is recommended for confined space entry.
<b>Clothing</b>	Long sleeve shirt and apron when potential for skin contact. Wear neoprene or nitrile rubber boots when necessary to avoid contaminating shoes.
